Experienced Practitioner Pathway

Our Experienced Practitioner Pathway is a personalised way to help professionals successfully reach that Chartered Membership goal. If you don't have a Bachelor's Degree, but you have over five years' management experience, then our Experienced Practitioner Pathway may be for you.



To grow your knowledge, you will need support from both your employer, helping you demonstrate and assess your experience, and also from a training course called the Chartered Membership Programme or CMP for short. You could be Chartered in two years.

Chartered Membership Programme (CMP) course

Professional Review; an assessment of your occupational competence, management competence and commitment to professionalism



Chartered Membership Programme (CMP)

CMP is a 6 to 12-month course, with one-onone support and classroom sessions to assist you with achieving your chartered status. An approved training provider will assess your experience against our Professional Review requirements. If there are gaps in your experience, these are identified early, enabling you to discuss your development with your employer and focus your training in these areas.

What will you learn?

Specialist knowledge and skills are required to manage construction projects effectively. CMP is four modules designed to give you the tools and tricks of the trade.

- · Construction business environment
- Construction technology
- · Health, safety and the environment
- Management

You will advance your skills in planning construction projects and health and safety best practice. Together, you will explore the factors that affect costs and procurement on a construction project. You will also develop a greater understanding of ground engineering techniques and substructure technology.

We assess your knowledge, not how well you cope with exam pressure

CMP's assessment is an open book exam. You will be given a construction project scenario and will need to answer four questions relating to the course's modules. We want to focus on your experience and knowledge of the industry, not your ability to cope with exam pressure. You have ten days to submit your answers, enabling you to use your choice of resources to complete your assessment.

This course will give you the technical skills and experience to approach your application for Chartered Membership with confidence.

The Professional Review

When you have successfully finished your CMP course, you can start your Professional Review application - this is the final stage before gaining your Chartered Membership.

You can receive support to help develop your Professional Review application and guide you through the assessment. Professional Review candidates will need to answer questions demonstrating:

- Occupational competence
- Management competence
- Commitment to professionalism

Qualified & Experienced Practitioner Pathway

Do you have a Bachelor's Degree or a Level 6/7 NVQ Diploma and solid professional construction management experience?

If so, our Qualified & Experienced Practitioner Pathway may be ideal for helping you reach Chartered Membership, with tailored support from the CIOB. You could be Chartered in three months.

What do we mean by "solid professional construction management experience"?

 Three years for those holding a built environment Level 6/7 NVQ Diploma, Master's Degree or Bachelor's Degree (or equivalent)

Or

 Five years for those holding a non-built environment Bachelor's Degree

The Professional Review

Your experience and previous qualifications mean you can immediately start your Professional Review application - this is the final stage before getting Chartered Membership.

You can receive support to help develop your Professional Review application and guide you through the assessment. Professional Review candidates will need to answer questions demonstrating:

- Occupational competence
- Management competence
- Commitment to professionalism

Upgrade to Fellowship

After you have achieved Chartered Membership, you could progress higher to Chartered Fellowship. Fellows are among the most experienced and knowledgeable professionals in the construction industry. They are recognised globally for their skills and achievements throughout their career. You could be a Fellow in 6 months.



Do you have more than five years' experience as a director or senior manager leading people and contributing to the industry and society? If so, you could apply for Fellowship. To become a Fellow, you must:

- Have significant strategic responsibilities for people and organisations
- Be able to demonstrate a significant contribution or influence of standards across your organisation, as well as the promotion of ethical and social responsibility
- Have responsibilities which extend to sector stakeholders
- Be able to show that you have implemented standards, developed strategy and/or culture change across your organisation, and are able to demonstrate the impact

Direct to Fellowship

Our Direct to Fellowship Pathway is specifically for directors and senior managers who work at a strategic level and are not already members of the CIOB. If you contribute to the industry, communities and society, and have more than five years' experience then, our Direct to Fellowship Pathway may be ideal to enable you become a prestigious Fellow of the CIOB.

Your experience and previous qualifications mean you could complete this Pathway in six months.

The Fellowship assessment and panel review

These are the final steps to gaining CIOB Fellow Membership. You will receive support and a workshop to help develop your written fellowship assessment and Panel review.

Candidates will need to produce a written report(s). One report all applicants need to write should demonstrate your competence in leading people and organisations within the sector.

Those who are applying directly for Fellowship will need to write an additional report based on a project or initiative you have led, which demonstrates you meet the professional review standards for MCIOB.

All candidates then attend a panel discussion, lasting approximately 1.5 hours. The discussion is based on your written project and an interactive discussion on a topical issue affecting the industry. Trained Fellows of the institute conduct this assessment.
