As part of CIOB's commitment to demonstrate competence and raising standards, a route to register as a CIOB Building Surveyor has been created for Chartered Members and Fellows based in the Republic of Ireland, in partnership with the Society of Chartered Surveyors Ireland (SCSI).

## **CIOB Registered Building Surveyor**

CIOB Building Surveyor registration provides a route to demonstrate your practical experience, as outlined in the Building Control Act 2007.

Registration is available to Chartered Members (MCIOB) and Fellows (FCIOB) who have at least two years' practical building surveying experience. However, it does not automatically guarantee a professional title with the Irish Register of Building Surveyors and Quantity Surveyors.

This route to registration is suitable if you have been employed on a full-time basis for a minimum of two years (or equivalent on a part-time basis), with experience in at least three of the following areas:

 Construction technology, building pathology, building measurement, condition surveys, planning acts, regulations and Building Regulations.

And you are working in at least one of the following specialisms:

 Design and specifications, building services, health and safety regulations, contract administration/costing, project management.

Alternatively, demonstration of specialised knowledge in any one of these areas in recent years, may be considered appropriate by the admissions board.
