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Iconic Building Challenge



The Shard, a 95-storey skyscraper on the south bank of the Thames, was completed in 2012 and designed by Italian architect Renzo Piano. It is the tallest building in the UK.

Tower Bridge, completed in 1894, is about 240 m (800 ft) long with a 76 m (250 ft) wide opening. Its twin towers rise 61 m (200 ft) above the Thames.



Chatsworth House, built in the 1540s by Bess of Hardwick, is the hereditary seat of the Dukes of Devonshire. It stands on the east bank of the River Derwent, between the Derwent and Wye valleys.
